Most of the events are free, while some may charge a small amount to cover the costs of putting on the event. OHA's youth field days give kids a chance to test their skills and get a taste of new outdoor activities. Many of OHA's youth days offer food kids love.

The yearly youth turkey clinic where several OHA chapters help out on April 1 leads off the list of OHA youth days. The

clinic will get kids ready for this year's youth turkey hunt weekend April 8-9.

More OHA youth field days will follow later in the spring and summer. OHA's Capitol Chapter will host a youth shotgun skills clinic on July 8.

NOW IS THE TIME TO PLAN YOUR FALL BIG GAME HUNT

ow is the time to make plans for your big game hunts this fall. The 2017 Oregon Big Game Regulations offer youth hunts for kids only, as well as guaranteed first-time tags in the general big game tag drawing.

Also, Oregon's Mentored Youth Hunter Program allows kids who haven't yet passed Hunter Education to hunt under the close supervision of an adult.

Youth hunts are available for deer, elk, antelope and spring bear.

The deadline to apply is May 15, 2017.

In Oregon's "first-time hunter" program, a hunter under age 18 who is unsuccessful in the controlled hunt drawing for deer or elk tags may reapply for a controlled hunt having a minimum number of tags and be guaranteed a first-time tag. 



10 COMMANDMENTS OF SHOOTING SAFETY


- 1. Control the direction of your firearm's muzzle. Carry your firearm safely, keeping the safety on until ready to shoot. Keep your finger off the trigger until ready to shoot.
- **2.** Identify your target and what is beyond it. Know the identifying features of the game you hunt.
- **3.** Treat every firearm as if it is loaded.
- **4.** Be sure the barrel and action are clear of obstructions and that you have only ammunition of the proper size for the firearm you are carrying.
- **5.** Unload firearms when not in use. Leave actions open. Firearms should be cased and unloaded while in a vehicle traveling to and from shooting areas.
- **6.** Never point a firearm at anything you do not want to shoot. Avoid all horseplay with a firearm.
- 7. Never climb or jump with a loaded firearm. Never pull a firearm toward you by the muzzle.
- **8.** Never fire a bullet at a flat, hard surface or water. With targets, be sure your backstop is adequate.
- **9.** Store guns and ammunition separately in locked spaces out of reach of children and careless adults.
- **10.** Avoid alcoholic beverages and drugs before or during shooting.











Pattern your shotgun, and know the limits of you and your gun. When hunting, shoot only from distances from which you can put several shot pellets in the kill zone.
