USFS considers limiting wilderness access

The Deschutes and Willamette National Forestautated a public planning effort. last June with the objective of reducing visitor impacts and preserving wilderness character on five central Cascados wilderness areas. OHW's Emerald Valley Chapter invited a Forest Service representative to a chapter meeting March 14. Numerous concerns and questions were shared following an introduction and request of audience by chapter president. Tony Hilsendager to listen to the presentation, he respectful of their guest speaker and ask questions specific to the proposal.

Wildenness area access limits are being considered for Mt. Jefferson, Mt. Washington, Three Sisters, Waldo Lake and Diamond Peak. This effort is well underway with the Forest Service annlyzing five alternatives, gathering public input on the alternatives and planning to issue a decision in 2018. The situation is apparent oversae on specific trailheads and campaites in the subject wilderness areas specific to the summer seasons.

The trend of loving the wildenness to death is not new, but the idea of restricting traditional hunter access as a response to concentrated trail and trailhead use in Ourmembers pointed out we are basically a solitary, dispersed use group who want to be accurated from the trail crowds to pursue our passion for the hunt. Many ideas, including using our recreational

hunting permits as an alternative to trail head parmits, were discussed. This is a complicated subject that has no easy answers. Our members also pointed out it is not a summer use versus fall hunting assess use; our activities range from early acouting to numerous hunt opportanities in the wilderness areas from spring. through late fall.

Our input on this issue as reasonable. hunters is important; there is a clear tread toward our traditional hunting horitage being overrun by new recreation methods and increasing human use of public lands. Coos Mountain Access Area opens coast lands

The Gregon Fish and Wildlife Commission at its March 16 meeting in Salom unanimously approved the proposed Coos Mountain Access Area project.

The project was brought to the Commission with a unanimous vote of the Access and Habitat state board.

The Coos Mountain project lies south of the Elliott State Forest and north of the Coquille

BLM. Rounburg Forest Products and Weyerhaeuser Company are participating by including some smaller parcels.

Part of the area is the common checkerboard pattern of private and public BLM managed lands. A block of Barnes and Associates lands connecting public BLM lands near Coos Ray is also included. This is great news for the dedicated elk and door hunters on the south Oregon coast. The Tioga Unit has the highest elk management objective in the state, providing 3,000 regular-again 2018 elk rifle tass in addition to late-season bow and mutablelenders hants.
