Legislature eyes conservation, poaching bills

The Oregon Legislature goes into session in February of 2018, and OHA will be sorting through about 2,000 bills that will be analyzed to determine what we will want to support, oppose or stay neutral on

Here is what we know is coming up so far:

Conservation Bill:

This is a bill concept that would allocate \$11 million from the general fund to support conservation programs administered by ODFW. The bill is coming from the office of Rep. Helm (D-Beaverton). A draft of the bill is scheduled for a late December release. OHA will analyze the bill to determine what effect it will have on wildlife and habitat programs administered by ODFW.

Poaching Budget Note:

OHA had a budget note addressing poaching included in the recent ODFW budget document that was adopted by the 2017 legislature. The note calls for the creation of a statewide anti-poaching campaign and requires ODFW to report to the 2018 Legislature on how such a campaign will be implemented. The Oregon Legislative Sportsmen's Caucus has made dealing with poaching in Oregon its top priority for the 2018 Legislative Session.

Poaching Law Bill:

The Oregon Legislative Caucus will support a bill by Rep. Helm (D-Beaverton) that will give the courts a bridge between the crime of the unlawful taking of wildlife and the penalty/restitution provisions currently in state statute.

Salmonberry Trail update: Hunting or No Hunting?

The December 2017 answer is yes on public lands, landowner choice on adjacent private lands. OHA has heard many recurring "no hunting on Salmonberry trail" reports. No hunting claims again followed a November 2017 call for volunteers to serve on an advisory council for planning the eastern "Valley" trail segment from Banks to Timber. OHA contacts with three major agency planning leaders confirmed hunting is not a planned prohibition. The reality is the trail regulations have yet to be written and you can help guide that process.

Planning the proposed 86-mile trail connecting Banks and Tillamook is a multimillion-dollar and multi-year effort in four segments; the "Valley" segment from Banks to Timber is the current focus. The advisory group for the Valley segment is limited to local participants in the Timber to Hillsboro area.

OHA partners with ODFW in Learn to Hunt workshops

A new partnership between ODFW and OHA chapters is providing beginner-level adults who are between the ages of 22 and 44 with the knowledge and skills required to hunt big game. The partnership includes training volunteers from OHA chapters to facilitate four Learn to Hunt workshops: Rifle Skills & Knowledge, Archery Skills & Knowledge, Hunting Techniques & Scouting, and Field Dressing & Butchering.

After going to www.Myodfw.com, clicking on Workshops & Events, selecting the desired workshop, and paying the \$52 fee, participants can attend a workshop. The next Rifle Skills & Knowledge Workshop is scheduled for Feb. 3 at Canby Rod & Gun Club located at 25011 S. Molalla Forest Rd., Canby, OR 97013. The list of items provided by ODFW includes training for instructors, venue (classroom and range), class notebook, weapons (firearms or bows), projectiles (cartridges or arrows), lunch, Range Safety Officers, and instructors.

OHA has an opportunity to assist by promoting the program and volunteering as instructors. Participants will also receive a one-year membership to OHA (their choice of chapters). They will join us in our mission to protect Oregon's wildlife, habitat, and hunting heritage. Specifically, this presents an unprecedented opportunity to partner with ODFW to promote, protect, and pass on our hunting heritage. Together we can start them on their path to becoming safe, ethical, and conservation-minded hunters.

After their journey begins, we are the perfect group to provide them with support and new information at monthly meetings, opportunities to participate in habitat and wildlife projects throughout the year, and mentors who will help them in the field during hunting seasons. Our engagement with them is vital to ensure an enduring commitment to our mission and long-term retention of new hunters.
