July's Guest Speaker: Corey Heath the head biologist in the Bend office of ODFW. You can visit their website at https://www.dfw.state.or.us.

If you missed it, you missed a good one. Corey provided the chapter with our own private overview of the proposed big game changes that will be presented to the commission for the 2020 big game season. And there are a lot of changes coming (potentially).

In an attempt to simply the regulations, 127 different big game hunts could get consolidated into 49 hunts. You might ask, does this mean a similar reduction in tag numbers? No. The total number of tags are slightly reduced but the simplification of hunts is meant to make it easier for those of us who go into the field to figure out the regs and stay legal. Here are a few changes that stand out.

There is a new system being proposed for damage control and management. This will be a damage tag that you can purchase at any license agent. It will primarily only be good for private land but will not be limited to a single land owner's property. ODFW has created some mapped areas where damage has been a significant problem and this tag will be good in any of the mapped areas. You'll still have to get permission to hunt on private lands. Also, if you already had a tag for elk that year, you would not be able to purchase an additional elk tag. This would be your only elk tag.

There's also proposed changes to sheep hunting. Due to the fact that some of the big horn sheep herds have reached populations objective and since there aren't any new areas that have been identified to establish new herds, ODFW is proposing adding some ewe hunts. Along with this proposal, comes language change to allow a hunter both a once is a lifetime ram and a one in a lifetime ewe. Currently the regulations just says once in a lifetime big horn sheep. Some of the John Day Sheep hunts are being combined because the sheep move around so much. Your tag could become good for either side of the river. Tag quantities should not change.

Western Oregon Deer changes: In the past the hunts were broken into bucks with two points or better and doe or spike hunts. The change proposes any buck with a visible antler and then the doe hunts will be doe only. That's the way it has been in eastern Oregon and again will make things more consistent.

If you've been a high-cascade elk hunter, be prepared for a change. ODFW is recommending this become a controlled hunt. The number of hunter has continued to increase in this hunt and the number of elk has continued to decrease so a change is needed in order to manage the populations according to objectives.

If you've been using deer or elk urine as an attractant or as a cover scent, that's being done away with. CWD (chronic wasting disease) can be spread through urine and this is a move to try to keep CWD out of Oregon. But don't' go through it out in the woods because that could cause the spread of CWD this is supposed to help prevent. Instead, dispose of it in your trash and have it contained to the local landfill or watch for ways to dispose of it properly to avoid spreading the problem.

There are a few new late season mule deer hunts being proposed. This is not because the mule deer are doing better. They are not and mule deer populations are still on the decline. This is because of damage and where these deer take sanctuary late in the year is on public lands. I won't spoil it for you. Watch for changes in the regs next year that indicate some new late season hunts (if the commission agrees to them).

For Pronghorn hunts, staff is recommending slightly later and longer seasons when the temperatures have dropped a little bit. This should reduce fire risk and wildfire conflicts. They are proposing new season dates from Aug 22 to Sept 6.

For Mountain Goats, they are proposing longer seasons as well in order to improve the hunting experience. Goat tags too are once in a lifetime so you should be allowed the time you need to have a great experience and a successful harvest. And with inconsistent starts to winter seasons, a hunter might need to hunt earlier or later depending on how soon old man winter decides to come visit.

Raise 'em Outdoor camp for kids was a big success. OHA was a major donor again this year. Over 100 kids attending this camp up out of Terrebonne. Archery, guns fishing, and other outdoor skills were on the agenda.

We received a letter from the Forest Service of their decisions notice for the Cascade Wilderness Strategies project which we participated in. If you've been following this, you know that OHA and other sporting groups were effective in getting some changes from the original draft plan to benefit hunters while still being supportive of the wilderness objectives.

Your chapter held a board meeting on June 26th.

We presented two scholarships to Oregon Youth Challenge members of \$1,000 each. Kevin and Doug were there in person to present them.

This fall Sportsman's Warehouse will be holding another Bucks and Bulls contest. OHA was asked to be a key sponsor again. We'll bring it up at this August meeting for discussion and a vote. If you drew a buck or bull tag, keep this in mind if you are able to fill your tag with a trophy this fall.

A few of your chapter leaders attended the OHA Chapter Summit at Diamond Lake recently. We'll provide an update on subject that face OHA in the coming months at our next meeting. It's always nice to network with other chapters to learn what works and doesn't for them and how OHA can make an important difference for hunters and sportsman in Oregon.
