### OHA PIONEER CHAPTER 2019 SCHOLARSHIP

#### Who is eligible for an OHA scholarship?

Eligible applicants must be new or returning college students enrolled in any accredited trade school, technical school, college or university. Applicants must be in a field of study which aligns with OHA's mission. Fields of study may include, but are not limited to: fish & wildlife, wildlife biology, forestry, environmental policy & planning, environmental law, public lands management, wildlife law enforcement, natural resources.

#### What must I do to be considered for an OHA scholarship?

Applicants must complete the scholarship application form.

A recipient may apply for the scholarship again in subsequent years; however, winners will be selected from all eligible applicants each year and past success does not guarantee future success.

If awarded a scholarship, the recipient will provide OHA with the college scholarship contact information. OHA will contact the school and arrange for funds to be provided directly to the school.

#### Eligibility

Applicant must:

1. Be a graduating high school senior planning to pursue a degree at an accredited institution of higher education as a full-time student or be currently enrolled as an undergraduate or graduate student.
2. GPA of 3.0 or higher
3. Be a current Oregon resident.

Submit all scholarship application requirements by May 31, 2019.

### Buck and Bull Contest—February 15



This annual contest at the February General Meeting is expanding to include open categories for Mule Deer, Black-Tailed Deer, Elk, Pronghorn, Bear, Cougar, and turkey. All entries must be from Oregon from the most recent season and should be accompanied by tags.

#### Come early on Friday, February 15th at 5pm.

Prizes will be awarded to 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> place in each category if applicable.

#### Youth Category

- Open to members and their immediate family including grandchildren.
- Separate youth categories are available for each species. All youth entries will receive a prize.
- Each animal is eligible for 1 prize (open or youth). Animals harvested before the hunter's 18<sup>th</sup> birthday are eligible.
- All entries must be from Oregon from the most recent season and should be accompanied by tags.
- Oregon animals from previous seasons are encouraged to be brought in for measuring and display, along with animals from other states or countries for display. These are not eligible for contest prizes.
