### ALL HANDS, ALL BRANDS FOR YOUR PUBLIC LANDS DERR MEADOW IN THE OCHOCOS – JUNE 14 – 19, 2021

Robbie Piehl, Ochoco National Forest Wildlife Biologist and other employees began preparation work on Derr Meadow on June 14<sup>th</sup>. OHA members began assisting on June 15 and as the week continued the momentum of additional volunteers including RMEF and retired USFS employees jumping in to get the preparation work completed was evident. Wire fence had to come down and T posts removed. Those that were certified with chainsaws cut out a line on the east side of the project so that the buck and pole material could be put in place and built.

Guzzlers 4 through 10 along with 900N and 900S were checked with some fence repairs being done, aprons cleaned and water bowls cleaned.

73 people came to Sugarcreek Campground with some just participating mid week. OHA Chapters that participated were Bend, Capitol, Redmond, Tualatin Valley, Mid Willamette and Emerald. RMEF, BHA, NWTF, ODFW and USFS were also part of this volunteer event. The name All Hands, All Brands For Your Public Lands was certainly evident.

Bend OHA had 28 members participate (including children and spouses) resulting in 562 hours of volunteer time which included travel time. Selfless dedication to a great cause was evident everywhere when you consider the cost of fuel and wear and tear of members personal belongings. One member had a tire destroyed and had to buy a set of four tires when he learned that his tire size was not available.

1,146 hours of volunteer time was recorded for the fence build and travel. An additional 40 hours for guzzler work. According to Robbie Piehl there was just over a mile of fence built which is protecting 32 acres of the meadow.
