

No on Ballot Measure 114!

REQUIRES NONEXISTENT PERMIT SYSTEM TO PURCHASE A FIREARM

The extensive permit-to-purchase system required by Measure 114 would take years to fully create and implement.

Firearms purchases would cease until the system could be implemented.

Only legal, law abiding firearms owners would be penalized by these infringements.

CREATES A SEARCHABLE DATABASE OF ALL PERMIT HOLDERS

All permit holders will be entered into a searchable database that includes all personal information, including photograph.

All firearms purchases are also entered into the database.

There are no parameters on who has access to this information and it is kept for an indefinite period of time.

REQUIRES ENORMOUS FINANCIAL COST TO TAXPAYERS

Projected costs for the creation and implementation of the permit process and database for 2023-25 are:

State Government (General Fund tax dollars):

\$15.4 million

Local Governments (County & Municipal tax dollars):

\$51.2 million

OUTLAWS FIREARMS THAT CAN HOLD 10 OR MORE ROUNDS INTERNALLY

Measure 114's ban on "large capacity" magazines includes both fixed and detachable magazines.

Any firearm with an internal tube or chamber that can hold more than 10 rounds would be banned.

For example, shotguns with barrels over 21" and many other firearms.
