

2024 White River Conservation Project June 8th & 9th



The White River Game Management unit provides critical wintering grounds for thousands of deer and elk from as far away as Mt. Hood.

This year we're fencing the first aspen stand to recover from the 2020 fire. Aspen is a treasured food source for big game. Buck & Pole fencing allows deer and elk to crawl through or jump over, but cattle can't.

What to Expect: We anticipate 20-40 people including kids. We camp at Crawford Barn which is haunted. Kids love it! The site is a large flat field with ample room for cars, tents, and trailers. Access is super easy off paved road 48. No power or water. Porta Potties are provided here and at the work site.

Most folks arrive Friday night and enjoy an informal BBQ. The work event is all day Saturday. A hot breakfast is served at 7:00 with orientation at 8:00, then we drive 30 minutes to the job site.

We'll break for lunch with a 'build your own' sandwich buffet and drinks. The work typically runs another 2-3 hours. Saturday evening is the big feed presented by Chef Nate in

partnership with Weston Dealerships. Lots of social time and tons of raffle prizes.

OHA supports game bird hunting opportunity, presses for sharp-tailed grouse restoration

At the April ODFW Commission meeting, OHA once again showed up to ensure we are maximizing hunting opportunity within the confines of sound science-based wildlife management.

WILD TURKEY - OHA previously supported a proposal to increase wild turkey hunting opportunity to address damage on private lands in Grant County, and now in western Oregon counties (Marion, Polk, Yamhill, Benton, Linn, and eastern Lane counties, excluding private industrial forest land).

We are supportive of the beardless fall turkey permit program, as long as ODFW continues to monitor turkey populations to ensure we don't see population declines among turkeys that predominantly use public lands. ✓ SAGE-GROUSE - It seems every year, sage-grouse hunting is on some Commissioner's chopping block, and every year OHA is there to remind Commissioners that our conservative sage-grouse hunting season doesn't contribute to any population decline. Further, it was hunter-harvested wing data that determined sagegrouse productivity (chicks per hen) in 2023 was the highest recorded since data were first collected over 40 years ago. ✓ SHARP-TAILED GROUSE - OHA made

the Commission aware that we're embarking on another effort to reintroduce native Columbian sharp-tailed grouse to northeast Oregon. This species was extirpated from Oregon in the 1960s/70s, so we feel it's time to work with sharp-tail experts from across the West to determine the best available habitat for another potential reintroduction effort.

OHA protects SW Cascade meadows, watershed; join us for next project phase on June 15-16

OHA and its 30 volunteers installed the final mile section of wildlife-friendly fence and completed protection of Whiskey Springs and Fourbit Creek meadows in April. These fences that OHA installed will both increase habitat quality for wildlife and help purify spring water for the Big Butte Springs Municipal Watershed. Of broad importance, these high groundwater infiltration areas ultimately provide drinking water to 140,000 people.

On June 15 and 16, OHA will move on to wildlife-friendly fence Willow Prairie about 10 miles from Whiskey Springs. Willow Prairie is another high-risk Cascade meadow that has seen its share of damage caused by intensive livestock grazing, illegal off highway vehicle use and other sources.

Plan to join us for this great project. Meals will be provided for volunteers, camping will be free at Whiskey Springs Campground, and you could win great prizes, including a deer shoulder mount donated by North American Taxidermy, and a Howa 1500 6.5 Creedmoor from Legacy Sports International. M-114 ruling faces challenge by state; status still on hold

Measure 114, the gun control measure narrowly passed in the 2022 election, is the subject of an appeal by the State of Oregon with the intent of implementation.

In November, Judge Raschio of Harney County ruled Measure 114 unconstitutional, issuing a final ruling in January that permanently banned its implementation. Oregon Attorney General Rosenblum then filed notice of the State's intent to appeal Judge Raschio's ruling.

As part of the appeal, the State requested a stay against Judge Raschio's ruling, which would allow the implementation of Measure 114 components while the case was further litigated. This request was recently denied by the Oregon Court of Appeals, which means Judge Raschio's injunction against Measure 114 remains in place.

The State's appeal will be before the Oregon Court of Appeals for the next three months with a ruling expected in August.

Meanwhile, the lawsuit filed against Measure 114 in federal court is pending an appeal to the Ninth Circuit following a July ruling that found the measure constitutional. OHA participated in this litigation by filing amicus briefs in support of the lawsuit. That appeal has been paused pending a ruling on a similar case, making its timeline unknown.
