



OHA engages in search for ODFW's next director

ODFW is on the cusp of a new era with the retirement of current Director Curt Melcher.

Effective April 1, Director Melcher is retiring, and the current ODFW Commission is tasked with the selection of the new agency leader.

The Commission and Governor Kotek are at the helm of the selection process with the Governor's office facilitating the recruitment and selection process and the Commission making the final selection from the winnowed list of applicants.

Selection of a new director is scheduled

for the May 10 Commission meeting.

OHA has been engaged with Commission members, as well as decision-makers in the Governor's office, to express our concerns and advocate for a director who can effectively lead the agency through a hotbed of social topics while remaining focused on science-based wildlife management.

An extensive background in wildlife management, as well as a strong understanding and belief in the North American Model of Wildlife Conservation, are crucial attributes OHA has put forth to decision-makers. Additionally, a knowledge of the principles of wildlife research

and how to apply those in an unbiased manner is another key characteristic a successful director should possess.

Another important attribute is fiscal responsibility for the agency and to the rate-paying stakeholders made up of hunters, anglers and trappers.

Understanding and appreciating that these stakeholders contribute 47 percent of the agency's budget is key to managing and conserving wildlife.

OHA will continue to work with the Commission members, as well as the Governor's office, to express the views and needs of the sportsmen and women in Oregon.

OHA scores big win to fund fight against CWD spread

After a two-year process, OHA has successfully secured funding for increased Chronic Wasting Disease (CWD)

monitoring, detection, and testing in Oregon.

In the spring of 2022,
OHA was concerned that CWD was
not included in the proposed
ODFW budget. As such,
OHA authored and championed a
bill for the 2023 legislative session
that would appropriate funding
from the State's General Fund to
both ODFW and the Oregon
Veterinary Diagnostic Laboratory
(OVDL) at Oregon State University.
That bill, HB 2532, died at the end
of the session.

Because of OHA's relationships in the

Capitol, the CWD funding package was brought back in the 2024 session, reincarnated as part of HB 4148, the wildlife omnibus bill. HB 4148 contained CWD funding, appropriations for the Invasive Species Council, funding for a new program to reduce human-wildlife conflict, and important policy language specific to wildlife crossing. While the bill itself died in Ways & Means, the funding portions for the CWD work and the Invasive Species Council made it into the end-of-session budget bill.

ODFW will receive \$795,000 to increase capacity in the Wildlife Laboratory and seasonal positions to assist with muchneeded sample collection. Additionally, the successful program that pays taxidermists and meat processors for

CURRENTLY, ALL OF THE SAMPLES ARE SHIPPED TO COLORADO STATE UNIVERSITY, TAKING IN EXCESS OF 7 WEEKS FOR RESULTS samples will receive a portion of those funds. Increased sample collection is vital to monitoring and potentially detecting CWD, should it be found in Oregon's ungulate populations.

The OVDL was appropriated \$1.9 million to increase laboratory capacity for zoonotic disease research and to establish important in-state testing for CWD. Currently, all samples are shipped to Colorado State University, taking in excess of seven weeks for results, by which time meat is already processed, and heads and spines are deposited who knows where. In-state testing will provide fast, reliable results to Oregon's hunters and position the state in a more proactive stance to process the needed increase in sample testing.

Securing this funding is a big win, not just for OHA and Oregon's sportsmen and women, but most importantly, for Oregon's wildlife.

Meadow systems are important for deer and elk, and across the western turn our attention to plan implementation. Cascades, meadows are at risk of loss, degradation and fragmentation due to conifer encroachment, heavy use by domestic livestock, illegal OHV use, and wildfire suppression, among other factors. Ultimately, OHA and partners will protect three areas in the Cascade Mountains (Willow Prairie, Short Creek, and Whiskey Springs/Fourbit) with 6.5 total miles of wildlife-friendly fencing to restore the resiliency of these mesic systems and provide habitat for wildlife.

OHA Klamath Chapter 2024 Bob Boring Scholarship

OHA awards scholarships to applicants based on the criteria identified herein while pursuing areas of study and careers that support OHA's mission of "Protecting Oregon's wildlife, habitat and hunting heritage."

Who is eligible for an OHA scholarship?

Eligible applicants must be new or returning college students enrolled in any accredited trade school, technical school, college or university. Applicants must be in a field of study which aligns with OHA's mission. Fields of study may include, but are not limited to: fish & wildlife, wildlife biology, forestry, environmental policy & planning, environmental law, public lands management, wildlife law enforcement, natural resources.

Who is not eligible for an OHA scholarship?

The following individuals and their family members are ineligible for awards: OHA officers and directors, members of the selection committee, trustees, and substantial financial contributors.

What criteria are used to judge applicants?

Applicants are judged on their application, eligibility requirements, volunteer work, essay and other materials provided. Applications will be reviewed by the OHA Scholarship Committee with recommendations to the board of directors. Below are the criteria by which each applicant's information will be evaluated. Consider the following points when answering application questions or writing your essay.

- Major course of study
- Involvement in OHA or other habitat projects (applicants will not be limited to OHA members)
- Extracurricular participation
- Leadership skills
- Community activities
- Awards
- Work experience
- Essay: Content, structure, and grammar
- Photos of you engaged in outdoor activities or community service
- An example of a goal you set for yourself and how you accomplished it

How are scholarship funds dispersed?

The scholarship funds will be sent directly to the school at which the student is enrolled and will be credited to their account. The scholarship award is a one-time gift and must be able to be used in the year it is awarded.

Any unused funds will be returned to the scholarship fund by the school to be used for future awards.

What must I do to be considered for an OHA scholarship?

Applicants must complete the scholarship application form.

A recipient may apply for the scholarship again in subsequent years; however, winners will be selected from all eligible applicants each year and past success does not guarantee future success.

If awarded a scholarship, the recipient will provide OHA with the college scholarship contact information. OHA will contact the school and arrange for funds to be provided directly to the school.

- 6. Essay of 1 to 3 pages (select one of the options):
- a. Explain how you would protect Oregon's wildlife and habitat.
- b. Explain how you would promote and protect the hunting heritage of Oregon.
- c. Explain the role of hunting and sportsmen in Oregon's wildlife management.
