REMINDERS FOR UPCOMING BIG GAME HUNTING —

Charge you phone & have an extra way of charging it with a power bank or charger if E-Tagging.

Bring something to write the confirmation number on and something to affix it to the animal—tape, clip, safety pin.

Purchase your tags, a voucher is not a legal tag.

Verify the hunt dates on the tag you possess before you go out.

Have your maps of the area, downloaded beforehand or have paper copies in a water proof bag.

Have a spare tire and make sure you have all the parts for the jack, etc.

Bring knives, sharpener, packs, bags & water. Good Luck!

They want to:

- Reduce human bear conflicts & educate the public on causes.
- Advocate for bear hunters and their methods including the use of bait and hounds.
