It is in this vein that the Oregon Partners in Conservation was developed this past year. It's initial success coupled with the desire to be known as an event open to all groups offering outdoor activities information, that has led to a rebranding. This event will now be know as the Oregon Recreational Partners in Conservation (ORPIC) to be held once again in the arena at the Deschutes County EXPO Center. "Recreational" was added so that folks seeing or hearing about it will know that it is Recreation organizations interested in the conservation of our state. It is about the recreation groups that want our outdoor visitors to learn that the users of the out of doors are also about keeping these lands open and available for all to use. It's a combination of various user groups that want to show some of the alternate activities available for recreation here in Oregon. The event has also been moved to a later date, in the spring and will be held on April 26th.

December Meeting Recap

In case you were unable to attend our monthly meeting at Bend VFW on Dec 11th, here are a <u>few</u> highlights:

Our guest speaker was **Bob Buddenbohn**, the media manager for the Bend Chapter. Ironically, he had his computer hard drive crash before the December meeting, so he was unable to share the originally planned presentation: how the board is working to prioritize where our available funds go, how the funding request form is used to help make this determination, as well as a draft of the 2025 budget for the Bend Chapter. When we see the budget on the screen at the meeting, it will make it more clear why we don't have access to all of the funds in the checking account to sponsor/donate to every request. (e.g., funds need to be held back for our pledges, for the next year's banquet, etc.) Bob reminded us of OHA's mission and asked us what more we can do as a chapter to fit in and help to fulfill this mission. Are we on the right track? To protect wildlife we have donated to or have spent volunteer hours: TIPS, collars, guzzlers, Hwy wildlife crossings, billboard. For habitat: All Hands, buck & pole, burn recovery, thinning. Hunting heritage: Youth & Family Outdoor Day, Youth Upland Bird Hunt. What more can we do for the future, to secure our traditions and hunting culture? What else can we do to draw in youth and families to our chapter and to hunting in general? (youth & family events, ORPIC, Learn to Hunt . . .) Nancy Doran reminded us that getting women involved is the key to securing a future for hunting. If you have ideas on how we can get more people involved in our chapter's activities as well as attending our meetings, please share those ideas with us. Most of the people holding this chapter

together are older, many are retired, and a few are looking to move out of the area. We need "younger blood" to get involved. Bob passed around a handout showing how we've used our funds this year. The percentages in each category have helped him to create a 2025 budget.

JR Lorimor was unable to attend the meeting because he had to run out to the woods and help his son **Jaret** get his elk home. (photo on page 9). JR wanted to remind us that if ORPIC is to continue, he needs an assistant and committee. Please think about how you can become involved. He would like to keep it under the OHA umbrella but is looking elsewhere because no one has stepped up to take over. JR is too involved in the new high school archery league to continue overseeing ORPIC. He needs to step away, but we don't want ORPIC to go away.

Bill Littlefield is working on a new system to keep track of volunteer hours. **Don Clark** will now help track everyone's hours and report to the state office.

Please get your donations turned in ASAP for the Mule Deer Classic fundraiser banquet in March. If you don't have a service or product to offer, perhaps you know someone who does. Anyone can also donate funds to sponsor a gun raffle or allow the banquet committee to purchase other necessary product.

The raffle proceeds from the December meeting (\$160) will go to the Family Kitchen. Congratulations to **Rex Parks**, who was the winner of our annual membership drawing! (\$500 reimbursement for outdoor related items) His name was drawn from all of the door prize tickets collected in 2024. See page 8 for the rest of the winners that evening.





More Success in the Field!

It was snowing out, hard. We had been out for hours with no sign of any animals, and I was given the decision to keep hunting or go get McDonald's. But while the temptation to give up was high, it was decided that we would push through and keep on hunting, and boy am I glad we did. We got out of the truck and started walking, and once my fingers were frozen and my breath was seen in the air, we heard them call. They sounded so close, not even a mile away, so we started running. My lungs were burning and my heart was pounding in my ears. Then we stopped, because not even ten yards away, laying in the blood covered snow, was a calf, two of them in fact. And as I was frozen, I heard a deep growl and looked up. This huge cougar went running from the bushes, stumbling from its old age, and when I say huge, I mean HUGE. This cat was trying to singularly take down two almost full grown elk at once and would've succeeded at it if we didn't happen upon them. Jaret, my hunting partner, ran after the cat, barking at it with the hope that it would run up a tree; but as we only had one gun, he chose to stay behind in case that wasn't the only cat. But the hunt wasn't over yet. We could hear the rest of the herd not too far away and started stalking them, trying to step as quietly as we could on the icy snow, running through it as our feet sunk far below the surface. And there they were, a huge herd of elk, peeking through the trees. I knelt down on my knees, feeling the cold seep through my pants, wetting my legs, and sending a shiver through me. As I lifted the gun, I could see a sliver of skin through the scope, only the part I needed to shoot, and I placed my finger on the trigger and jumped. I had left the safety on, so this time I turned it off, breathed, and BANG. You could see the bullet fly through the snow as it went towards the herd, making the world go in slow motion. The cow jumped and her herd ran past her, leaving us with no visuals on my shot placement; but as we walked towards her, Jaret stopped, turning to me and beaming. I had got her, a perfect shot, she was dead, and I just got my first elk.

EVEN MORE SUCCESS IN THE FIELD!

Finally, on the very last day of the antler-less elk tag I had to hunt it, I had a cow hanging up. Months before, when I drew the tag, I was ecstatic about the opportunity to have one last youth tag, and at the very same time, my first elk tag. And I thought, oh I thought, how simple and how much easier a cow would be to find and kill. Much easier than a bull, surely! Well, my unsuccessfulness up to this point was certainly not for lack of opportunities. Calls from the community came from left and right, seemingly the entire town teaming together with me in efforts to fill my tag! After a few missed shots and a hunt of seeing five bulls and no cows, my hope in myself was wavering. Discouraged, I decided to give it one last go, doubtful that today would be the day. Little did I know that morning, first thing crossing onto the old dirt road I was so familiar with, we would cross elk tracks less than five minutes old, chase them, I would miss, chase the herd for about another mile, and turn around again, discouraged, and empty handed. After this last miss, my friend Jaret took one look at me, and said "How bout we try and rid you of that flinch?" I knew I was a flincher, and knew it was messing up every shot I was taking. Out of pure habit, even the click of the rifle would make me jump out of my skin. A few practice shots and fake clicks later, I felt more ready, more collected than before. So, the very same day I had missed so miserably, I was out to try again. This time, as we were driving around a bend, Jaret pointed out my window, saying, "Guess what, guess what? There they aren't." Only this time, there they were! Right where he was pointing, there stood a large herd of God's beautiful creatures. Now was His time to bless me with one in my freezer! We jumped out and crouch-ran so we could see over the crest, and sure enough, there was that large herd. Moving. So, we moved. For over a mile, we chased them at a half-sprint half-speed walk over the slipperiest snow out there. Far too often we could see them through openings in the thicket, but it was only torturous without the opportunity to get a shot through the thick branches. All we could do was watch, chase, and pray, a lot, that they would slow down enough to get a shot off. Soaked with snow, sweat, and whatever all else, we chased until we... at least 1, was dead on my feet. And then we kept going. Finally, after about a mile of high-speed chase, there they were, sun-shining on them, shining in the glory of the Lord. Clustered together, I waited, scope trained on them, waiting in agonizing silence as I waited for a broadside shot. And then, there it was, a perfect broadside shot. After a breath in, a self-reminder to stay calm, and a quick little mental replay of the wisdom that came from Jaret earlier "Make a good shot, you don't want one of God's creations to have to suffer." I was ready. As ready as I was going to get for the deafening BANG that followed the squeeze of the trigger. Jolted back to reality a few seconds later, I scanned the forest, watching the area I had last seen her. There she was, and after watching her jump, I remembered I needed to be ready to make a finishing shot, if need be. "You hit her." I heard from behind me, and with a squeal, I could no longer suppress the excitement I needed to make a good shot. Adrenaline flooded my veins and I realized how close I was to possible success. We could see her laying in the snow, which was good, but she was still moving. I shot a quick prayer up, pleading I would have the sound mind to make the final shot if needed. Sneaking up, she looked hurt and dying, or maybe that was just my lack of experience. Just to be safe, I shot once more, a for sure vitals shot from about 35 yards out. Then there she was. My first elk

ever! More excited than I could describe, but even more so, grateful. So grateful. Grateful for the blessing of an elk, grateful for the time out in a breathtaking creation, grateful for time with friends and family, and just grateful for everything. Although it was a bit of arduous work, quite a lot of time, and a good chunk of failure, all those aspects only added to that gratefulness. And with that, I ended the season with my first validated elk tag.
