### **February Meeting Recap**

In case you were unable to attend our monthly meeting at Bend VFW on Feb 12th, here are a <u>few</u> highlights:

Our guest speaker was Kristin Fratella, who shared with us just about everything we needed to know about Chronic Wasting Disease (CWD). She also brought an ODFW co-worker, Zac Kendall, who helped answer our questions on other topics as well. Since there is minimal space here to summarize the presentation, you can find more details on the ODFW website. CWD has been around since the 1960's and is caused by a protein. The animal can appear healthy for up to 2 years, yet it is 100% fatal and there is no cure or vaccine. No more captive facilities are allowed in Oregon, so as permits expire, they will not be renewed. Testing is encouraged on harvested animals and the sampling process takes less than 10 minutes of your time. Results take 3-5 weeks. ODFW has a goal of 4,000 samples. They are at 3,800 samples and the year doesn't end until July. Some taxidermists and meat processors can take samples for you, as well as pop-up check stations during hunting seasons and drop bins at local ODFW offices. It has not yet been detected in Oregon, but it has been found in our 3 neighboring states. The disease has been detected in deer, elk, moose, caribou. White tail are more susceptible than mule deer or elk. If you hunt where CWD is prevalent, wear gloves, avoid cutting thru bone and leave your carcass. You can soak your tools in a 50% bleach solution. Besides the obvious modes of transmission (nose to nose, saliva, feces, urine, in utero), the disease can get into the soil, be absorbed by the plants and then consumed by the animal. Currently there is no indication that a human can contract the disease.

In 2026 there will be new deer hunt areas. The 47 current units will be reconfigured to 30 larger units.

Bob Buddenbohn sends the digital newsletter and his monthly announcements from his new email address: oha.budd@gmail.com By drastically cutting the number of newsletters that are printed and mailed, the Bend Chapter is saving about \$10,000-\$11,000 per year.

ORPIC was cancelled for this year because no one was able to take over the reigns in time.

We are working on making some changes to the chapter by-laws in order to streamline the grant/funding process, while still enabling the board to fulfill their fiduciary responsibility.

Have you been thinking about becoming a board member? Now's your chance! As you read in Rex's president's letter on the front page, JR & Carolyn Lorimor will need to step down from their board positions as of April 1st. Although we will greatly miss their dedication, skills, and support to the board, we understand the importance of dedicating their focus and time to the High School Archery League. The main focus of Carolyn's Secretary position is taking notes at meetings and producing the minutes from the board meetings. JR has been the Outreach Coordinator and also helps to schedule the speakers for the monthly membership meetings.



## Bend Chapter OHA Charles L Beckley Scholarship

It's time for your student to apply for our annual scholarship! Application packets must be postmarked by April 15th. The link is on our website.

Here is a bit of history:

The Bend Chapter of the Oregon Hunters Association, in partnership with **Bill Beckley**, has established this scholarship for higher education honoring the life-time member **Charles L Beckley**, who passed away in 2004. Mr. Beckley was a dedicated OHA member and was among the first hunter education instructors in the state of Oregon. This scholarship assists young men and women in reaching their educational goals. Charles Beckley, who graduated from Oregon State University, was instrumental in bringing FFA (Future Farmers of America) to Central Oregon as Bend High School's first vo-ag instructor and FFA advisor in 1952. He was chairman and founder of "Red Hat Days" in the late 1950's as a precursor to hunter safety. He became one of the first hunter safety instructors in the state when he began teaching hunter safety to his ag students in the early 1960's. In 1962, he became the first high school teacher in the state of Oregon to teach wildlife and forestry fulltime. He created his own curriculum which he later expanded to include hydrology, ecology, and conservation. Among his many affiliations, he was most proud of his lifetime memberships in the Oregon Hunters Association and National Rifle Association. We honor his memory with this scholarship.

### **NWTF HONORS ROBBIE PIEHL & MONTY GREGG**

Last month two local Forest Service employees were honored with one of the National Wild Turkey Federation's Making Tracks with the USDA Forest Service awards, which recognize people and projects that best incorporate conservation education, partnerships and wild turkey management. Robbie Piehl and Monty Gregg received the Habitat Management Program Award for their efforts to improve habitat in the Paulina Ranger District of the Ochoco National Forest. The focus of the project is to remove western juniper to enhance and restore sagebrush and bitterbrush habitat, to create foraging potential for several species, including turkey, elk, deer, sage grouse and pronghorn. The first phase of the project began in October 2024, just over a year after signing the stewardship agreement with the NWTF. This project was successfully carried out despite delays from wildfires in the area. Robbie and Monty both worked hard to secure partner funding for the project, using several partners including the Rocky Mountain Elk Foundation, the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife, and the Oregon NWTF State Chapter. The Oregon Hunters Association also helped to support this endeavor. \$10,000 from OHA BMEI funds went towards this project. (Thank you to NWTF and **Eric Brown** for the details of this article)



### OHA to help build massive wildlife crossing over I-5

Oregon's first wildlife overpass will be built on I-5 at milepost 1.7 south of Ashland, thanks to a coalition of conservation groups, including OHA, and agencies that successfully obtained a \$34 million federal grant.

Federal funding is paused, but state funding that was secured is moving the project forward until federal funds arrive (hopefully in 2027).

State OHA has worked with the Southern Oregon Wildlife Crossing Coalition since 2021 on this effort to reduce wildlife-vehicle collisions and improve habitat connectivity. OHA has played a critical role in providing relatively small amounts of funding for the project's feasibility study, attaining support from Jackson County Commissioners, supporting state legislation, and committing to oversee minor fence repairs associated with the new structure.

Each year in the western United States, wildlife-vehicle collisions account for an estimated \$10 billion in vehicle damage, medical expenses, and hundreds of thousands of dead animals. These staggering numbers are derived from reported crashes, so the actual costs are likely much higher. Wildlife-vehicle collisions are a huge problem for Oregon's deer and elk, and we hope that this project will pave the way for construction of additional structures across the state.

### OHA backs bill to limit ballot-box wildlife management

As the legislative session progresses, OHA continues to work in the Capitol on behalf of the sportsmen and women of Oregon.

OHA has authored two concepts for the 2025 session. Working with Senator Nash and Representative Owens, we have brought forward SJR 30 and HJR 11, concurrent bills that would require a higher number of signatures for initiative petitions to reach the ballot while also requiring those signatures to be gathered in all six congressional districts. The bills have strong bipartisan support in both the House and Senate.

Working again with Representative Owens, OHA has authored HB 3596, a bill to extend a current ODFW study on mule deer population metrics to include the Steens Mountain area. The data gath-

ered in this study may help shape population management decisions in the future.

Notable bills that OHA has engaged on thus far:

**SB 769** - This bill would allow counties to vote to exempt themselves from the statewide ban against hunting cougars with hounds. This bill had a public hearing on Feb. 11 with OHA staff providing the presenting testimony.

**HB 2170 & HB 2982** - These bills address funding for the invasive species inspection and the efforts to keep potentially devastating invasive species,

such as quagga muscles, from entering the state. Both bills had a public hearing on Feb. 10.

**SB 812 -** Removes the sunset on the Landowner Preference Program. OHA

provided supporting testimony at the public hearing on Jan. 30.

of Veterinary Medicine and the Oregon Veterinary Diagnostic Laboratory (OVDL). OHA is strongly supporting this bill as it continues vital funding OHA secured for the OVDL in the last legislative session to begin in-state testing for chronic wasting disease samples.

Several bills important to the hunting community remain on the horizon: HB 2342, the ODFW fee in-

crease bill; HB 2977, an alternative funding source for ODFW; and HB 5009, ODFW's budget. OHA will continue to engage on these bills, and many others, as the legislative session progresses.
