President's Message

Hello to all our members of the Bend Chapter of the Oregon Hunters Association.

As of June 20, our total membership was at 510. We extend a warm welcome to our 5 new members. From Bend, we now have **Angie Campbell**, the **Ryan McGrew Family**, **Michelle Schmotzer**, and **John Wiley**, and from La Pine **Frank Zojonc** joins us. Thanks for becoming members and we hope to see you at an upcoming meeting, on a project or any of our other activities soon. We have 3 members who have missed their renewal date and are in danger of missing out on continuing to be a part of one of the premier conservation organizations in the state. Remember to check your membership expiration date that's on the address label of your Oregon Hunter magazine.

Here we are just beginning the summer season, and we're already seeing human caused wildfires. Many of you that know me personally know that I have been a long time volunteer firefighter here in central Oregon with the Cloverdale RFPD. Our small fire district was one of the early responders to the recent Alder Springs Fire where we sent 4 pieces of apparatus and 9 firefighters. I witnessed several retardant drops from multiple planes that afternoon and into the evening. That fire resulted in levels 1 through 3 evacuations that caused a lot of anxious Crooked River Ranch residences to be displaced from their homes. This human caused fire was the result of an extremely careless individual burning his TP. As I told our Task Force Leader after he'd told me the cause, if the person had buried it, no damage would have been done. As I've said in the past, be aware of your surroundings when you're out scouting or recreating, don't be "that guy".

Several members headed out into the Ochoco's early in the week for the **All Hands, All Brands** project, to do maintenance on guzzlers and check past years projects. Last years fire that swept through the area resulted in a lot of habitat loss, damage to some past buck and pole fencing and at least one guzzler being completely destroyed.

Saturday, August 2nd there will be a 3D archery shoot at the **La Pine Archery Park**. This is where what is being dubbed as a "**mini ORPIC**" will also happen. The chapter will have a booth there. Mark your calendar now so you don't miss out..

June Meeting Recap

In case you were unable to attend our monthly meeting at Bend VFW on June 11th, here are a <u>few</u> highlights:

Our guest speaker, Mikayla Bivona, Acting Prineville Assistant Wildlife Biologist for ODFW, presented on data collected by Central Oregon ODFW staff in 2024 regarding wildlife call responses in the Deschutes and Ochoco districts. Overall, the Bend and Prineville offices responded to over 120 wildlife calls in 2024, roughly 80% of which involved deer. The leading report categories were "entanglement/attached item" at 31%, "Vehicle Collision" at 17%, and "Fence Injuries" at 12%. Overall, about 47% of the calls resulted in euthanasia, 29% release, 12% dead upon arrival, and 12% no action taken. The presentation focused on the prevention of these issues and how we can be more aware of the hazards our yards face. For example: don't feed the deer and elk since that is not their natural diet (this includes no grain from the feed store even if it's labeled for deer); clean up your yard of dangers such as hammocks, fencing, volleyball & badminton nets, etc.

ODFW will be conducting a porcupine research project in the Deschutes Watershed. Anecdotal evidence shows that porcupine populations are declining across the western United States. In Oregon, they are listed as an unprotected mammal, but they will be added to the list of Species of Greatest Information Need in 2025. There is currently minimal research published in Oregon regarding porcupines on our landscape. We're currently working to gather public reports and confirm porcupine presence throughout the study area. Moving forward, we will be capturing and radio-collaring porcupines. The data generated will provide information on home range size, seasonal movements, mortality sources, den locations, and general habitat preferences.

Kevin Borst gave a recap of the Youth and Family Outdoor Day. (you probably already saw this in last month's newsletter) We had over 50 volunteers, including a dozen cadets from the Oregon Youth Challenge Program. There were about 130 attendees (only 4 families were no shows). **Brooke Snavely** from Central Oregon Daily (KOHD) was kind enough to come and cover our event. (Thank you!) His segment The Great Outdoors recently aired. If you missed it, you can find it on the Central Oregon Daily website, in the weekly features section. It first aired June 25, 2025 and is titled: Families bond over bows, birdhouses and bass at Oregon Hunters Assn. Youth & Family Day

The Archery 3D Shoot at the La Pine Archery Park is scheduled for August 2nd. There will also be a mini ORPIC since the event at the fairgrounds was cancelled this Spring. A sign-up sheet was at the June meeting for anyone who is available to help "man" the Bend Chapter booth and/or help with set-up and take-down of the event. If you want to help, sign-up at the July meeting or talk to Don Clark.

Mountain View Trap Team submitted a request for our continued support. Rex announced that the board approved \$3500. (see page 10 for the results of the teams recent competition)

Usually found in trees or rocks. Occasionally found wandering in the open

September Sight-In Clinics are on the Calendar

Every September for as far back as I can remember, we host a sight-in clinic before deer and elk seasons. The event is open to the public and both COSSA members and non-members are welcome. There is usually a nominal fee. But the advice and the insight provided by COSSA volunteers is hard to put a price on. Every year, I plan around the sight-in clinics. I attend some years to get help and other years to lend a hand. Last September I volunteered to help at the clinic and the first person to show up with his rifle was a 4-tour veteran of the Iraq and Afghanistan conflicts.

We talked about his rifle, a 300 Winchester Magnum and discussed his upcoming elk hunt in Wyoming. We determined what ammunition he would use and the advertised drop at 200, 300, 400 yards and beyond. After a couple of shots at 25 yards, we found the point of impact and he began to build a group at 100 yards. It was a matter of a few minutes to zero the rifle and then, because we were on COSSA's 200-yard range, we were able to engage steel targets out to 500 yards.

I talked to the hunter at an event last month and he showed me a picture of a great Wyoming bull elk that he had tagged on that hunt last October. As it turned out, that session at the range helped him a lot, both on what rifle and load to bring, as well as how to employ the rifle and the optic at long range.

Be watching the calendar. COSSA will offer 4 days of sight-in clinics in September. It's a public service that you can tell your friends about. Bring hunting companions and young hunters or old hunters. It's a great time where a little personalized advice and personal attention can make all the difference on October and November deer and elk hunts.

The 2025 sight-in dates are: Sept 13 & 14 and 20 & 21

Special events are being planned, So stay tuned for more info next month



<u>Spread the word</u>: have the kids in your life complete a Hunter Education class this Summer so they can attend the OHA Bend Chapter's Youth Upland Bird Hunt in October. Check out the ODFW website for details about the online course and upcoming field days.
