A BIG THANK YOU to Rob Ward for being our July guest speaker. Rob is a drone pilot and brought some drones in for examples and also showed us some of his work through still photos and videography presentation.

Rob obtained a Remote Pilot Certificate by taking the FAA study course which costs \$100. Then he had to obtain an FAA Tracking Number (FTN) by creating an Integrated Airman Certification and Rating Application (IACRA) profile prior to taking registering for a knowledge test. Scheduled an appointment with an FAA approved knowledge testing center and then passed the initial aeronautical knowledge test "Unmanned Aircraft General—Small (UAG)". Once completed then he had to complete some forms and they process and send the National Remote Pilot certificate to you.

To become a pilot, you must;

- ♦ Be at least 16 years old
- ♦ Be able to read, speak, write and understand English
- ♦ Be in physical and mental condition to safely fly a drone
- Pass the initial aeronautical knowledge exam:
 "Unmanned Aircraft General—Small (UAG)"

Certificate holders must complete an <u>online recurrent training</u> every 24 calendar months to maintain aeronautical knowledge recency.



Some things to note—

You must be a commercial pilot to be able to present your data anywhere besides a family gathering. You must have a waiver to be able to fly over people outside. (Not inside)

You can only fly up to 400 feet high.

There are places that you must get a approval from the FAA prior to flying near.

You cannot land or take off in a wilderness.

You can fly in a National Forest.

You cannot harass people or wildlife.

Rob has done surveys for large areas for real estate and agriculture areas for vegetation index and thermal imaging. The drones can seed, spray or measure items. Drones can cover events like biking, running, fairs, concerts, car shows really whatever you can dream up, you can cover.

Rob showed us an event, All Hands All Brands for your Public Lands which is a habitat restoration project that he just did and he was able to show the work party cutting down willows and putting them in the beaver dam analogs plus other general clean up.

He has a software that stiches the video and stills together to make it a presentation and has recently added narration.

Rob is FAA certified, a Veteran and fully insured.

Rainier Jr/Sr High School Varsity Male Tristin Stout took 1st place plus individual Overall.








