July Meeting Recap

In case you were unable to attend our monthly meeting at Bend VFW on July 9th, here are a <u>few</u> highlights:

Our guest speaker was Isaac O'Casey, from the SALT Youth Outdoor Ministry at High Lakes Christian Church in La Pine. Since the Bend Chapter has contributed funds to this program (in particular, to support the youth hunting activities), we invited him to come and share how the program works. The goal is "To introduce the youth of La Pine to a lifetime love for Jesus, hunting, and their community." They accomplish this by pairing Christ-loving adult outdoorsmen with La Pine area youth and get them outdoors. The average Wednesday night attendance of middle school and high school students is 100. Isaac says the program serves about 300 total students. Many of the families don't have a dad in the home. The outdoor activities begin with adventure days: hikes, explore a cave, climb a tree, etc. Then the students are introduced to shooting sports, hunting, and fishing. In 2024 the youth program had 30 hunters, who were invited to participate in 3 upland bird hunts and a turkey hunt. There were 10 hunters on that turkey hunt. The 2025 targets (goals) include introduce 10 students to hunting/shooting for their FIRST time, go on 5 hunting trips with students, perform/join a land cleanup day. The OHA Bend Chapter's donation helps to fund outdoor awareness events, hunts, training days, and community service projects. Course fees, license fees, ammo costs, boots and other essentials are supplied with our help.

Eric Brown gave us a recap of the successful and productive All Hands All Brands weekend in June. See pages 9, 10 & 11 for pictures and the follow-up report.

Eric also gave us more details on the upcoming COSSA Sight-In Clinics in September. See page 5.

We were reminded of the Mini ORPIC in conjunction with the 3D Archery Shoot/Bowhunter warmup event at Three Rivers Archers Archery Park in La Pine. See pgs 5 & 11 for a few photos from the day.

Brian Gainer informed us that the Oregon bill trying to ban hunting & fishing is once again attempting to make an appearance on the 2026 ballot. (this info is also in the August OHA Tracker; check it out for more details)

The membership voted for \$750 to the Yow's Youth Hunting Camp, pending board approval.

Video #1 from the All Hands All Brands drone footage was shown. It was recorded by **Rob Ward**, professional drone operator and OHA member from the valley.





COSSA PARK PUBLIC SIGHT-IN DAYS

COSSA Park has offered Public Sight-In Days each year in preparation for the upcoming fall hunting seasons. This year between 10am to 4 pm on September 13 -14 & 20 - 21 for only \$10 (per gun) you can sight your rifle in at a bench at the 100 yard line and have the opportunity to shoot out to 500 yards on gongs. Kids are free and will be provided an orange ball cap while supplies last. You will need to bring your ammo and firearm. COSSA will supply the targets and have experts on hand. On the 2nd weekend a person from the Oregon Zoo Non Lead Education will be on hand to hand out free common caliber non lead ammunition for you to try. Deschutes Arms Employees will also be on hand to assist on the 2nd weekend. This year each person 21 and over will be entered to win 1 of 4 Silencer Central Solo .22 Suppressors. The winner will have the opportunity to upgrade and pay the difference. We will also be giving away a Leupold VX5-HD3 - 15 x 44 scope with custom dial. COSSA Park is located just past mile marker 24 on Highway 20 East on the north side of the highway. Follow the signs to the Fockler Range. You can find COSSA online at www.cossapark.com







ALL HANDS ALL BRANDS FOR YOUR PUBLIC LANDS

Here is an abbreviated version of **Eric Brown's** follow-up article:

Bend and Capital Chapter members began showing up on Monday June 23 in order to check past projects and do repairs. We maintain 12 guzzlers in the Ochoco's and 3 of them were destroyed by last year's fires. The rest of the guzzlers were serviced on Tuesday and Wednesday by OHA and RMEF.

On Thursday we shifted our plans with the night before an OHA member contacted a USFS fire crew and requested a message be sent off to **Robbie Piehl** or **Monty Gregg** that we needed T posts and a roll of smooth and a roll of barbed wire. On Thursday 8 of us went to Derr Meadow where we built a mile long buck and pole fence in 2021. Approximately 20 locations along the fence had burnt and we put in temporary three strand wire between the bucks to keep the cattle out. This was a ten-hour day and the eight of us were pretty much exhausted.

Additional volunteers began arriving on Wednesday, Thursday and Friday. On Friday some volunteers cut willows in preparation for the BDA (Beaver Dam Analog) work to be done the next day. A USFS crew shocked fish and relocated them and four of us went about the forest replacing green dot information signs. Others cut juniper trees to be

used for the BDA's.



Saturday was the primary BDA work reinforcing existing BDA's, shocking and moving more fish, cutting

more Willows and cutting down a large section of Lodgepole that had encroached into the meadow. Another group built fence at an area where many past problems have occurred with road closure violators. **Ross Scrocca**, USFS also re-certified about 8 volunteer sawyers.

Tradition was carried on with our Saturday night potluck with a tasty 10-ounce Rib Eye on the BBQ prepared by **Rich Stutheit** and **Greg Petsch**. Raffles were held and the group was then entertained by two musicians and singers. Sunday began with a breakfast provided by NWTF who were the lead brand this year and afterwards volunteers began departing. 2 Bend OHA members (**Kevin Borst & Rod Legg**) went to Rager to assist with a Hunter Safety Field Day put on by OHA member **Gordon Brown**.

This year saw a much bigger variety of NGO's coming to participate and some that travelled a long distance. (Utah, Seattle, Salem . . . even the UK) Not in any particular order, some of the participants were: NWTF, Think Wild, Western Beavers Cooperative, High Desert Museum, Heart of Oregon Corps, Portland Zoo, Oregon Department of Forestry, ODFW, RMEF, BHA, NWTF, MDF, TRCP, and at least 4 OHA Chapters were represented.

Rob Ward, OHA member in the valley and professional drone operator, flew his drones for three days capturing a ton of data and events. He is putting together a two-part video. With his drone he located two additional beaver houses that the FS was not aware of.

The Bend OHA Chapter is very fortunate to have the relationship that we have with **Monty Gregg** and **Robbie Piehl**, Ochoco USFS Wildlife Bios. These two have the personalities and desire to make All Hands happen. They have brought in several other USFS personnel that each have a specialty which involves the work we do.
