#### **August Meeting Recap**

In case you were unable to attend our monthly meeting at Bend VFW on Aug.13th, here are a few highlights:

Our guest speakers were **Andrew Walch** & **Zac Kendall**, both ODFW Wildlife Biologists. They had a lot of info to share, with many details in their powerpoint show. They spent time thoroughly answering our questions. Thanks to Zac for the following summary:

- Mule deer hunt areas will be changing beginning in 2026, and that map is published online (https://myodfw.com/articles/eastern-oregondeer-hunts). These changes represent our findings after around 1400 collars have been deployed over the past 10 years, and these changes better align harvest with biological herd ranges meaning we will have better synergy between harvest data and population counts. The department is submitting the final proposal for those new boundaries to the commission at the September 12th meeting in Ontario, so any feedback should be submitted to the commission by then. Feedback can be submitted via email to odfw.commission@odfw.oregon.gov, or in person but that requires 48h advance sign-up.
- Locally, our deer herds continue to struggle with habitat fragmentation and development, roadstrikes, predation and disease, but we had strong buck ratios this last fall across the district. Elk numbers seem to be stable to slightly increasing across the east Cascades portion of the district, with a record count in Metolius this past winter.

 We also had a record mountain goat count throughout the central Cascades, and the first hunter will have the opportunity to harvest a goat this fall.

Any questions about local changes (deer or otherwise) can be directed to the Bend office (541-388-6363), and we'd be happy to discuss the changes and proposed tag numbers.

Rex announced the OHA State Awards winners from the Bend Chapter. These were presented at the OHA Summit in July. See photo on page 7 and details of the awards on page 11. (Reminder, JR's photo appeared in the August newsletter.)

David Sill legacy gift: since this gentleman has no heirs, 260 acres outside of Hillsboro will be donated to OHA upon his passing. This property will be used for Learn to Hunt, youth hunts/events, etc. A veteran hunt has already been scheduled for 2026.


A new procedure to report them

# THE OHA BEND CHAPTER'S RECIPIENTS OF THE ANNUAL STATE OHA AWARDS

Nominations for the State OHA Annual Awards were submitted this Spring and the results were announced at the OHA Summit held at Diamond Lake in July. Below are the nomination letters:

The Bend Chapter was honored with Chapter of the Year. The nomination highlighted many of the chapter's efforts and accomplishments: The Bend Chapter's annual banquet and fundraiser has consistently had one of the highest annual net proceeds. This year's banquet netted over \$114,000 to help in furthering OHA's mission. When chapters were asked to donate to the Blue Mountain Elk Initiative (BMEI), the Bend Chapter was the first to pledge a continuing annual donation of \$10K toward this worthwhile endeavor. In 2024, the Bend Chapter stepped up to support the initial request for the Mule Deer Fund with a \$10,000 donation and assured the State office of providing further financial assistance for the struggling mule deer population. In 2024, the Bend Chapter initiated and along with OHA State funding helped organize the first ever Oregon Partners in Conservation event. This is a free public event providing information and hands on experience with regards to numerous recreational activities individuals can participate in the outdoors. The Bend Chapter's annual Ochoco guzzler and fence building and repair work project has morphed into the All Hands, All Brands for Your Public Lands. The Bend Chapter continues to be the key group with organizing and coordinating the volunteer work. The Bend Chapter has worked with US Forest Service biologists, multiple NGO's along with other OHA Chapters to make this a highly successful event. In recent

years this working group has built Beaver Dam analogs to attract establishment of beavers and to improve wetland habitat. Since 2016 when the first wildlife under crossing project in Oregon was built, Bend Chapter volunteers have provided maintenance and repair work associated with these wildlife under crossings. ODOT and the ODF&W staff recently attended a chapter meeting to recognize the volunteers for their much-valued volunteer work with these wildlife underpasses. Recently, the Bend Chapter, along with State OHA, have been included on the Bend to Suttle Lake Wildlife Crossing committee. As invited members, OHA can provide input in regard to overpass/underpass locations and to provide input on fencing options. In 2024, the chapter has donated funds to OSP wildlife officers to purchase much needed field equipment to assist them in prosecuting wildlife poaching cases. The Bend Chapter also partnered with ODF&W to purchase billboard space to promote the TIP program and provide messages warning motorists of wildlife migration. Multiple chapter members from Bend are engaged in monitoring and contacting the legislature for Oregon to voice their opinions regarding issues in which hunting, trapping and wildlife habitats are threatened. In 2024, members of the Bend Chapter volunteered more than 1,665 hours of habitat related work.

Bill Beckley passed away before the award was announced, but it was given to his family. Here is his nomination for a Special Award: Bill is the son of one of our Charter Members, for whom he, in partnership with the Bend Chapter, helped establish the Charles Beckley Scholarship Raffle, which has been in existence since 2004. This raffle and its proceeds through the annual scholarship fund, assists young men and women in reaching their educational goals. Bill is a long time Life Member of the OHA, so long in fact that his membership number has only 4 digits. Bill's long standing relationships in the local community have given him the opportunity and connections to reach out to multiple businesses for their continued support to our chapter's annual banquet and fundraiser. This, along with his personal donations and his recent taking on as our banquet chair has helped our chapter maintain its excellence in keeping the Bend Chapter's Banquet as one of the highest netting in the state.

**JR Lorimor** was also the recipient of a Special Award. Here is the nomination letter:

JR's most recent success was the planning and organizing of numerous conservation minded outdoor groups in order to put on the first ever OHA Oregon Partners in Conservation Event held at the Deschutes County Fairgrounds on Feb 3, 2024. This year-long process for JR, with ODFW and other NGO members, put together an outstanding opportunity for OHA to get our faces and voices out to the general public. Now JR, along with his wife **Carolyn** and other like minded hunting oriented individuals in the community have been key in the development and beginning of the Oregon High School Archery League. The first ever Oregon Indoor High School Championships were recently held at the BowTech Archery Campus in Eugene. This will be followed up with the first ever Oregon 3D Archery Outdoor High School Championships to be held at the La Pine Archery Park on May 31st. JR's passion is quite evident in his commitment to archery, our state's youth and to our continued hunting heritage.
