September Meeting Recap

In case you were unable to attend our monthly meeting at Bend VFW on Sept. 10th, here are a few highlights:

Our guest speaker was **Tim McClurg**, Bend Chapter member and FFL holder. As promised, through his detailed presentation, he showed us how to purchase (or sell) a firearm online, through online gun auctions and consignments, including how the firearm is shipped through an FFL. He explained the ins and outs of the whole process. He ran out of time to complete his whole presentation (how to sell a firearm online), but here are a few highlights:

- Define what you are looking for, what the parameters are, and what it should be worth. (MSRP, model #, any recalls) Do your research before starting to bid, otherwise you can get caught in a bidding war & end up spending a lot more than you should.
- Make sure you'll pass the background check before you start bidding and have permit if needed
- Each auction site has its own search engine. Read the reviews of the site.
- As an FFL, Tim charges \$80 to receive a gun
- Do you have a firearm that you would like to sell? Talk to Tim. as he does that for clients.

Reminder: We have positions available for you to join the board, let your voice be heard, and help this chapter to remain strong. We also have non-board banquet committee positions open. Come join the fun.

CO Land Watch and the Warm Springs Tribe are appealing the recent decision to allow the Thornburg development to move forward.

As requested by the OHA state board/office, we discussed the concerns/advantages of hiring an Executive Director at the state level so the members' ideas could be reported. We recommend a 3 year Sunset Clause with benchmarks to be met. As the ED attains funds from other sources, then the extra 15% of banquet funds should be returned to the chapters.

Against the finance committee recommendation, the board passed the proposal requested at the July meeting to support the efforts of the Yow's Youth Hunting Camp with \$750. The board supported the members' decision.


A new procedure to report them

Hunting for big bucks for wildlife

The outlook on the 2026 Legislative Session, commonly known as the Short Session due to its 5-week timeline, is being shaped by fiscal shortfalls. Oregon's politics in 2025 have set the table for a challenging landscape for any bill concept that will require state funding. From the 2025 session ending without a transportation package, to the stop-andstart special session wrangling of an acknowledged short-term fix for roads and immediate needs, the lack of availability of state funding has been underscored. Add in the September Revenue Forecast predicting an \$373 million shortfall, and the picture becomes more clear.

Dollars & Sense

Even in well-funded bienniums, the Oregon Legislature does not prioritize the funding of natural resource agencies. The General Fund, otherwise known as our tax dollars, is used to fund state agency budgets every two years. Of the \$37 billion dollars of General Fund allocated for the 2025-27 biennium, a mere 1.5% goes to all 16 natural resource agencies, with only 0.2% ending up at ODFW.

What does this mean for OHA and the sportsmen and women around the state? Likely, it means we will need to continue finding other funding avenues for our priorities of protecting Oregon's wildlife, habitat, and hunting heritage.

Welcome to the Hotel Oregon

One plan to address this need was brought forward in 2025: the transient lodging tax bill. The original concept,

HB 2977, would have increased the state transient lodging tax (TLT) by an additional 1%, raising it from 1.5% to 2.5%. Even with this increase, Oregon's statewide TLT would remain among the lowest in the nation. The revenue created from this increase would go to ODFW for conservation efforts such as the State Wildlife Action Plan.

As the bill was worked in the session, it was amended to change the increase from an additional 1% to 1.25% for a rate of 2.75% and add additional programs to the list of funding recipients. The final version included funds for the Wolf Depredation Compensation Program, invasive species response, additional anti-poaching capacity, wildlife connectivity programs, Oregon Conservation and Recreation Fund, and a wildlife stewardship program. These changes garnered strong bipartisan support, moving the bill out of the House and to the Senate for final approval. Unfortunately, through late-session political maneuvering, the bill was not allowed on the Senate floor for a vote before the end of session.

Picking up the Tab for Wildlife

OHA has worked on this concept since its inception in 2021 and will support it again in 2026. We see the value in creating new revenue streams for ODFW that are additive to the costs currently shouldered only by hunters, anglers and trappers. Creating a funding stream that will be paid predominantly by out-of-state travelers is the first step in broadening the scope of fiscal responsibility for Oregon's wildlife management.

Women of OHA get coordinator

Changes coming to Oregon mule deer hunting in 2026

Eastern Oregon mule deer hunt areas for the 2026 season were approved at the September Oregon Fish & Wildlife Commission meeting. Nothing has changed for the 2025 season, but it's official: mule deer hunt areas will look very different for the vast majority of hunters in 2026.

These changes are a result of ODFW beginning to monitor and manage deer harvest within Oregon's 22 individual mule deer herd ranges. Modeling mule deer population performance and harvesting deer within respective herd ranges is biologically sound and should improve management of mule deer.

Starting in 2026, there will be just 43 total mule deer hunt areas, and generally speaking, these hunt areas will be much larger than we're accustomed to. These larger hunt areas may provide additional opportunities to hunt multiple landscapes with the same tag and offer hunters the opportunity to move from emergency closures (e.g., wildfire) and still hunt.

However, hunters should know there are a slew of potential pitfalls associated with these new, larger hunt areas. Overcrowding in highly coveted spots, increased difficulty in drawing certain tags, and hunters' typical hunt areas being split by new hunt area boundaries top the list of concerns hunters are likely to experience in 2026.

As we harvest deer within herd ranges, the current hunt area boundaries within the herd ranges have little biological significance. The hunt area boundaries are essentially drawn to manage hunters, and that is why hunters' input after the 2026 mule deer season will be imperative to address obvious issues.

Mule deer herd range (and hunt area) names were recently changed to avoid confusion with existing wildlife management unit names still being used to manage elk, pronghorn, etc., so don't be alarmed by these new herd range names.
