June Meeting Recap

In case you were unable to attend our monthly meeting at Bend VFW on June 10th, here are a few highlights:

Our guest speaker was **Bill Cogley**, CEO/ President of Trash No Land, a volunteer organization promoting responsible target practice on public lands. Since Wendy was out of town, thank you to **Rex Parks** for supplying this summary:

Bill Cogley of trashnolands.org., an organization dedicated to safe and responsible recreational shooting on public lands was our guest speaker for our June meeting. Bill gave a great power-point presentation that showed us a lot of the areas before and then after their group's work was completed.

While out on public ground in 2014 he came across an area that had been trashed by shooters. After cleaning that area he contacted the Forest Service to see what could be done to educate and cleanup other impacted areas. That conversation lead to trashnolands.org, which became a 501(c)3 in 2017.

The group is dedicated to cleaning public lands in Oregon and Washington that have been abused by shooters without regard to the regulations that have been established for target shooting in those areas. They assist forest management agencies in developing quality shooting lanes and broadcast their message through extensive volunteer efforts to clean, educate and keep those public lands open for future generations to use. Trashnolands is an all volunteer organization. Their mission foundation is education, awareness of rules, ethics, stewardship, safety and pride of ownership. They promote awareness and seek solutions surrounding responsible shooting on public lands.

When the group finds or is made aware of locations that are in need of clean up or improvements for safe shooting they will set up, usually with pop-up canopies and signage to announce their presence to other users. They hand out trash bags to encourage these users to help keep the shooting areas clean. Some of their work parties have included raffle tickets for donated items to reward those that join in with the cleaning and clearing work. One of the groups that have assisted in their clean up efforts are members of The Gambler 500. During these organized clean-ups, instruction, bags, pickers and lunch are provided.

ODF has worked with trashnolands to disperse shooting areas away from OHV and 4X4 trail systems. On Wolf Creek in the Tillamook State Forest, trashnolands has been key in cleaning up, establishing clear shooting areas with shooting lanes and back stop berms. Jersey barriers and large boulders are being used to establish a clear firing line and to keep vehicles from entering the shooting zone. At the present time there are 4 established target shooting areas with different distances in the Wolf Creek area. ODF has been approached about future plans to enlarge and lengthen the current areas, along with clearing trees and brush that can create fire hazards. Smaller shooting areas are preferred since those are easier to control the shooting lines. Another of the upcoming improvements is the creation of wheel chair access for handicapped shooters.

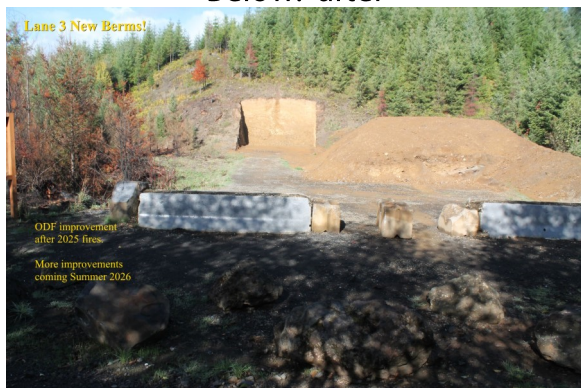

June Meeting Recap continued

Too many trees are being shot up by using them as targets, target holders or as backstops. In the past there have been at least two smoldering fires that have been traced back to the use of tracer rounds and shooting into trees. Both of those, along with the use of Tannerite or any explosive round, are illegal on state or federal public land. Their hand outs includes the "Common Rules for shooting on State and National Forest lands", along with some common sense practices on how to select a good place to shoot responsibly.

Outdoor Day recap: Thank you to all the volunteers, who helped make this event a success! 228 registered participants, but 190 attendees who showed up (we sent an email to all of the registrants with the start time, driving directions and other useful info, and we still had 11 families no-show) There were 55 volunteers, which includes the 10 cadets. We actually received some evaluation forms this year: 1/2 of them heard about us on tv, 1/3 were word of mouth; favorite activity: 1/2 of the replies said shotgun; archery and the sporting dogs each received 1/3; OSP & Mtn Man were both mentioned; the BB gun station was really missed this year-- when asked what they'd like to see added next year, the only activity listed was BB gun, by several people. Next year we're going to set a cutoff of 250 registrants. (this year we hit 228) With volunteers, that's at least 300 people that we are trying to park and feed.

Your Chapter at Work

Enhancing Habitat Protecting Our Hunting Heritage

Three Bend Chapter OHA members patrolled the Wildlife Fence along US 97 from Lava Butte to Vandever Road finding and cutting 5 trees off the fenceline which likely fell during the most recent storm.

A Side by Side and a Quad were used for this patrol, resulting in a total of 31 miles being driven due to the up/back along both sides of the fence is 15.5 miles. The largest tree down was south of Sunriver Jct on the East side of the highway. This tree was discovered down last week and another Bend Chapter member cut away the highway side of the tree and made sure that we could wait and do the complete work today.

While patrolling we did jump an injured Bull Elk which was South of Sunriver Jct approximately a mile and was on the highway side of the fence. The Elk had an obvious rear leg injury and most likely struck by a vehicle. The animal continued NB along the fence bumping into the fence often and once out of sight would lay back down. A State Police Fish and Wildlife Officer was responding to our call in case the animal needed to be put down however the animal reached a jump out location just south of Sunriver Jct and took it. We did not see the animal again (Likely a future wolf meal).

During our patrol we once again discovered damage to the shoulder of the highway. The damage was next to a previously reported washed out area that ODOT quickly got to and filled with rock. They have been notified of this new damage along with another location further north of this site.

The 3 OHA members have a total of 19.5 hours of volunteer time that went towards this project.

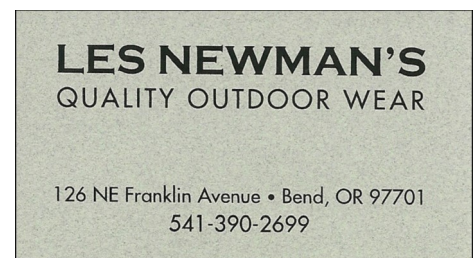

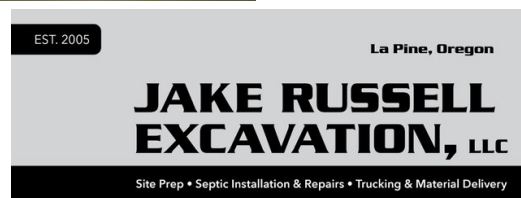
WE NEED YOU!

ALL HANDS, ALL BRANDS FOR YOUR PUBLIC LANDS

Many volunteers once again came together for the annual All Hands, All Brands habitat work party. (June 19-21) This year we saw Oregon Hunter Association Chapters from Bend, Redmond, Ochoco, Emerald and Capital. Also present were RMEF from around the State, BHA, MDF and Western Beavers, USFS Ochoco Wildlife Biologists, Oregon Department of Forestry Lead Wildlife Biologist, Oregon State University College of Forestry Educator and an ODFW Wildlife Biologist.

Volunteers began showing up at Sugarcreek CG as early as Monday and we began numerous projects on Wednesday: guzzler maintenance and fire damage removed; removal of a few dead trees; patched fence at Derr Meadow; prepping for Saturday's main work party by placing fencing supplies where needed, installing T posts, and "surveying the scene" . . .

Ross Scrocca, USFS got several volunteers re-certified on chainsaw use. We are very fortunate to have Ross as one of our volunteers and his willingness to keep us up to date on chainsaw use.

State Police Fish and Wildlife Senior Troopers **Scott Vaughn** and **Taylor Jerome** (he was the speaker at our May meeting) visited our two main work party sites which was appreciated.

On Saturday (main work party), **48 volunteers** spent the day completing three projects:

- Complete the fence build placing 2.4 miles of wire around the fence.
- Build a fence around Guzzler 6 along with building the apron (see photo below) over the top of the water tank.
- Fell several trees into a stream bed.



There was, of course, no shortage of food to fuel the hard working bodies: Friday evening, we had an appetizer get together which was rather impressive. Our Saturday potluck was again a big hit with everybody bringing a side dish with the main course being BBQ steak. (Chad Marks-Fife, USFS Eugene area once again provided entertainment with the playing of his stringed instruments and singing.) We ended the event Sunday morning with a nice breakfast of beer pancakes, bacon, eggs, juice & more.

Overall volunteers put in **635 habitat hours** and **386 hours of driving** to the project and back home. With the federal volunteer rate being \$36.14 that is an impressive value of **\$36,898**.



All Hands began in 2019 with the concept being to include more NGO's that have a common purpose with habitat work and accomplish more goals. That has been achieved and we are already talking and looking forward to 2027. We have established a great model on how to succeed with **Robbie Piehl** and **Monty Gregg** being a very big part of why we have been successful.

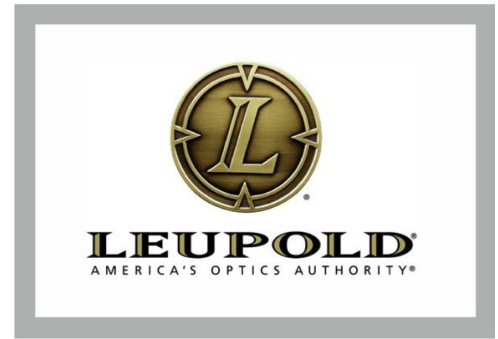

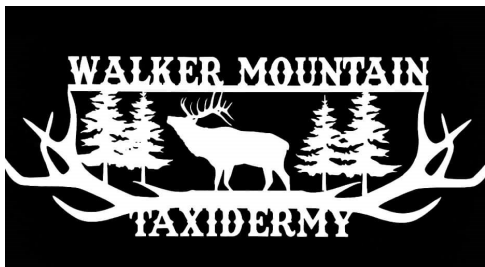

MVHS Trap Team: 2A State Champions!

The Mountain View Trap Team has taken the 2A State Champion title in both Varsity and JV. The team competed against 14 schools and over 300 athletes in their division on June 28th. The team earned several top placements at the state tournament. **Brady Hadfield** shot a **perfect score** and was the tournament champion with 100/100. Anders Meyer snagged 3rd place varsity male with a 98/100. For the varsity females Kathryn McGovern took 1st place with a 96/100 and Rylee Hurt 3rd place with a 92/100. For the JV division top male with a 1st place was Evan Franklin with a 95/100 and 2nd place was Isaac Bailor with a 90/100. For the female JV Julia Luke placed 1st with a score of 88/100. Madeline Bitner received 1st place novice female with a 70/100. The varsity team scored 484/500 Brady Hadfield 100, Anders Meyer 98, Cole Hurt 96, Kathryn McGovern 96, and Leon Nofziger 94. The JV team scored 445/500 Evan Franklin 95, Isaac Bailor 90, Julia Luke 88, Jimmy Rickabaugh 86, and Luke Davis 86. The team did great and for a lot of these competitors it was their first time participating in the state event. We as coaches are very proud of these athletes' shooting ability, but they are also responsible and respectful young adults which means just as much. We would like to acknowledge the sponsors, volunteers, and donors that make this team possible, we couldn't do this without them. The team is looking forward to our fall season and getting back out on the range!

DO YOU KNOW ABOUT IP28?

IT WOULD CRIMINALIZE HUNTING, FISHING, TRAPPING, FARMING, RANCHING, AND WILDLIFE MANAGEMENT

WHAT IS IT?

IP28 is an initiative petition, not a legislative bill, aimed at the 2026 ballot.



It seeks to change the animal abuse statutes to **criminalize hunting, fishing, trapping, killing animals for food, education and research with animals, wildlife management practices, and even trapping mice & vermin.** It would classify breeding animals, to include domestic pets, livestock, and equine, as sexual assault.

It is an attack on a self-reliant lifestyle. It would create a 'no kill' sanctuary state, forcing Oregonians to a vegan diet or to have their meat and dairy products shipped in from other states, making us more reliant on the national food network for our food resources.

WHO'S BEHIND IT?



IP28 is driven by an **extreme, animal rights and vegan agenda** centered in Portland with out-of-state influences. (It was formerly known as IP3 & IP13)

The proponents of IP28 are currently gathering signatures to qualify it for the ballot; they have until July 2026 to gather over 117,000 signatures.

HOW DO WE FIGHT IT?



1) Educate everyone around you about this extreme measure and how harmful it would be to all Oregonians. Make sure they understand:

Do not to sign anything for IP3!

2) **Register to vote!** If this initiative makes the Oregon 2026 ballot, we need everyone to vote NO!
